

Choose one of these activities a week and turn in either your picture or drawing. Your Drawings can be emailed to me, just take a picture and email it to: keela.olson@norfolk.k12.ar.us . You can also turn the assignment in at the school as well. You can only do each project once!! You can use the paper provided for the drawings. You can use the inside of a cereal box, cardboard, etc. If you are working on one of your projects at home, I would rather you spend time each week finishing your project if you took it home. You need to email me picture updates of your work. I am also here if you need anything. Just email me.

- ❑ Create a blind contour line drawing of yourself. To do this you will not look at your paper while drawing and you will not pick up your line. You are going to be focusing on the important lines, e.g, contour, eyes, lips, hair, ears, eyelids, nose, etc. Use your entire paper, cardboard, inside of a cereal box.



- ❑ Create an opt art composition focusing on shading and value. The goal of this project is to have smooth transitions from dark to light. Here are instructions on how to do this step by step. <https://kinderart.com/art-lessons/arthistory/op-art-shaded-shapes-lesson/> This is the goal. You can use different colors if you have them, but if not a pencil is fine!!

- ❑ Look up a Youtube video on how to draw a detailed drawing of eyes, using a pencil. Turn in your drawing.
- ❑ Find a circle in your house that is around 2 inches in diameter. Trace this 12 times. Then turn these circles into different objects. Be creative. They all have to be something different.
- ❑ Look up foreshortening art and create your own photo focusing on foreshortening. Remember to take lots of pictures at different angles. Sometimes it is better to get on the ground or stand on something to get an interesting angle.

- ❑ Look at the photos of Adam Hillman, <https://mymodernmet.com/things-organized-neatly-adam-hillman/> He takes everyday objects and creates an interesting composition. Look around your house and arrange them into an interesting composition. Turn your photo in!!

- ❑ Recreate a famous artwork and take a photo. You have to send a picture of the famous artwork you chose and your recreation.
- ❑ Draw a detailed sketch of an everyday object around your house. There needs to be shading and the object needs to be in proportion.
- ❑ Draw a detailed sketch of an insect.
- ❑ Draw a sketch of what you think your teachers have been doing during Quarantine
