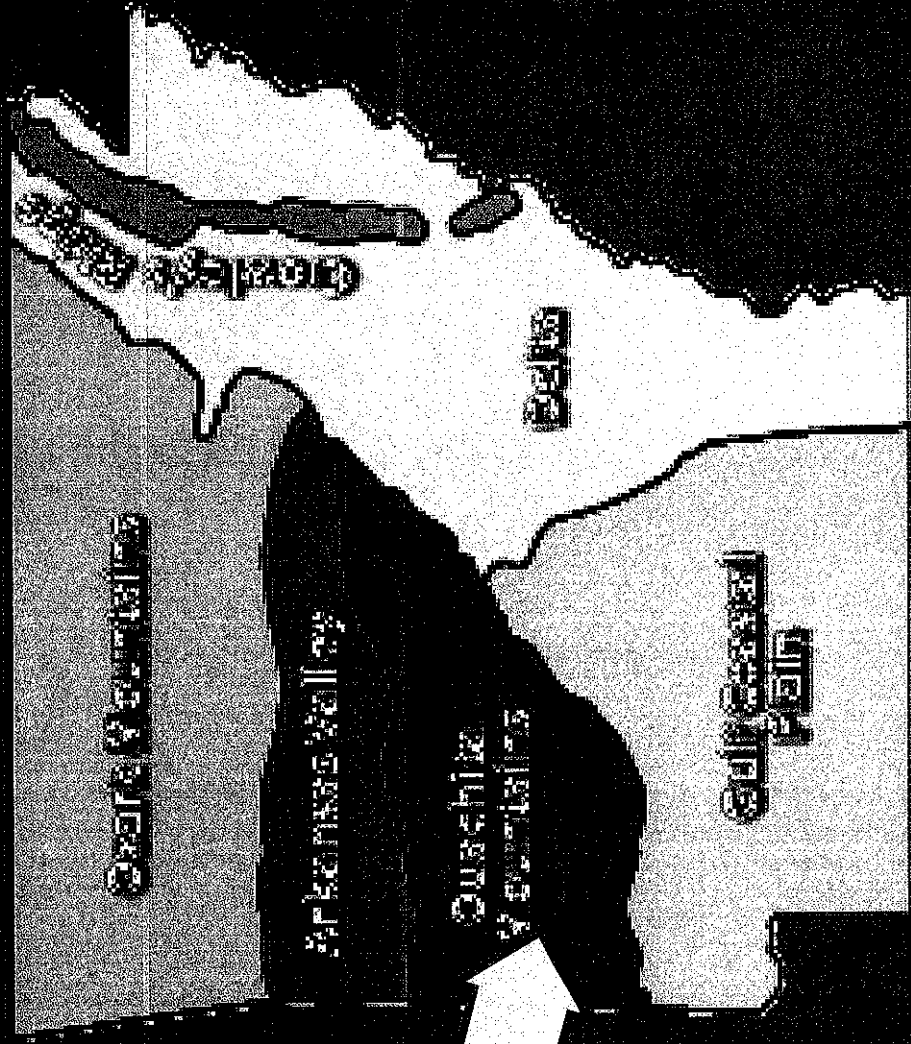

- Has Hot Springs National Park





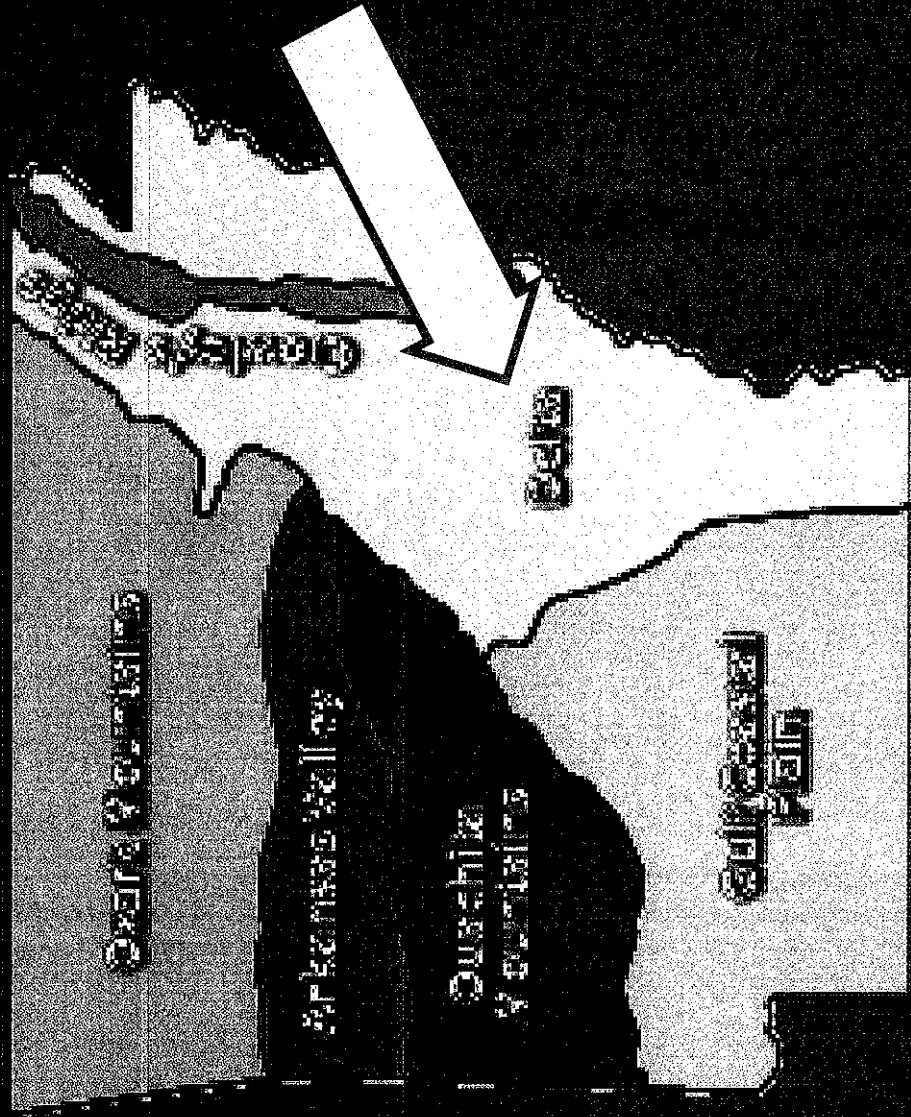

# Delta (Mississippi Alluvial Plains)



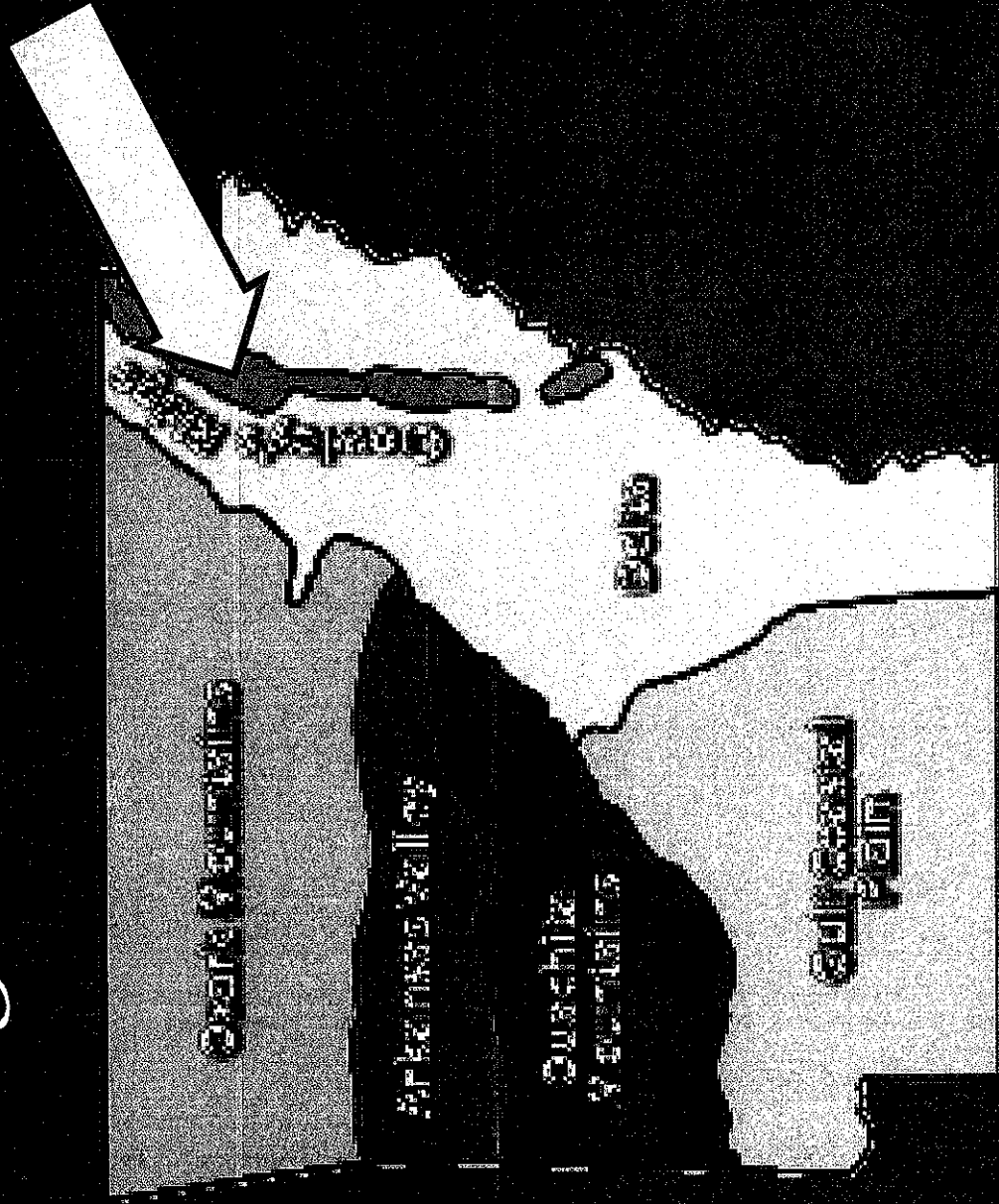
## Delta (Mississippi Alluvial Plain)

# Delta

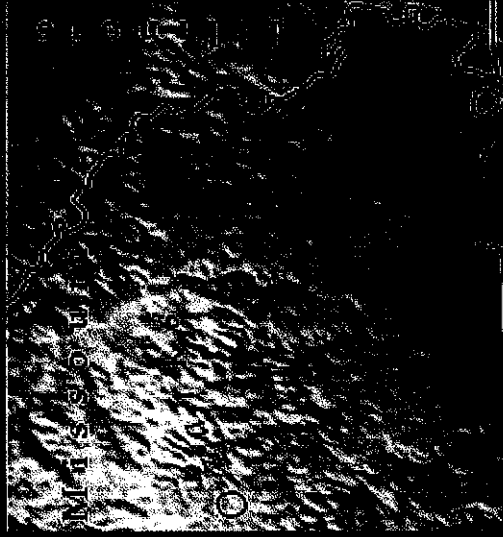
The Arkansas Delta is a flat landscape of rich alluvial soils formed by repeated flooding of the adjacent Mississippi.

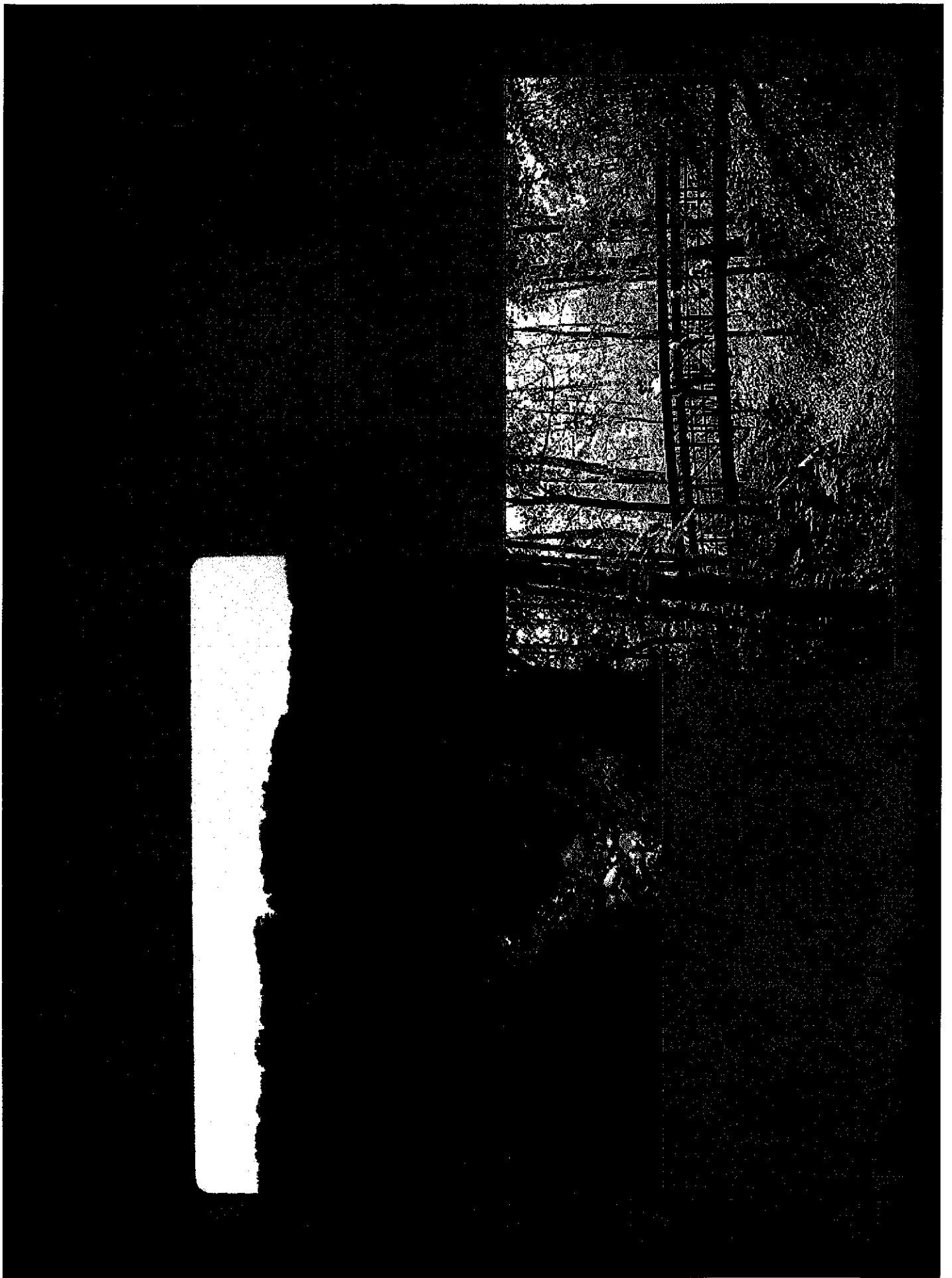

# Crowley's Ridge

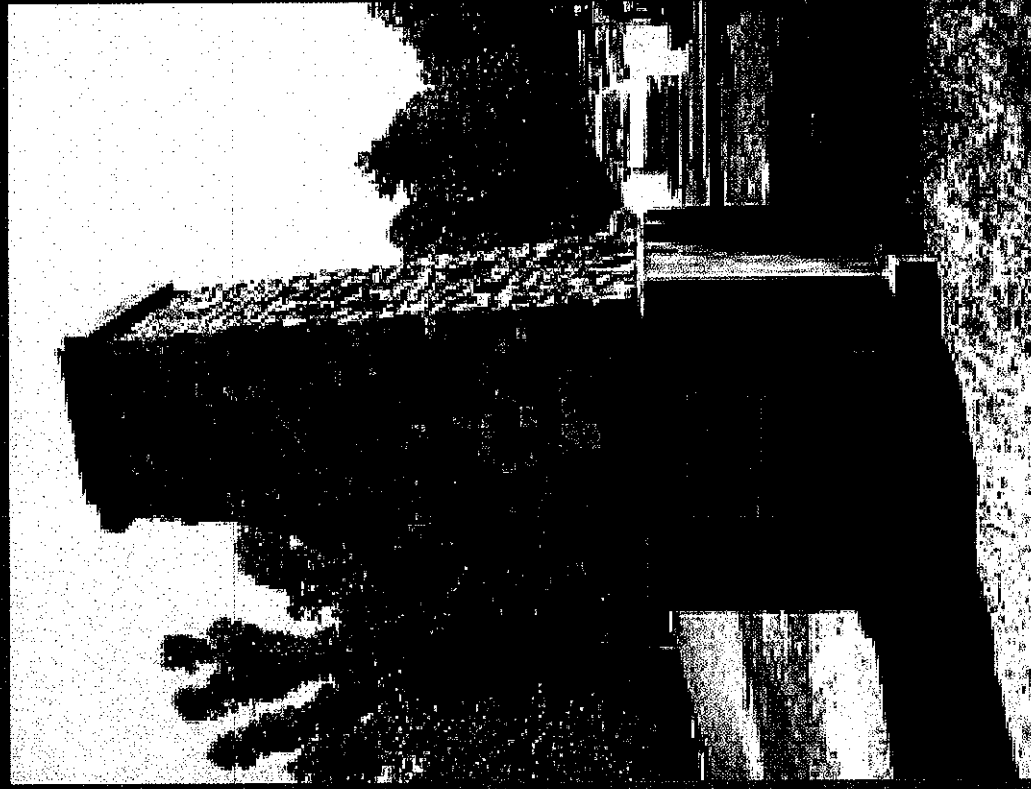
- In the lowland region

- Smallest region in Arkansas



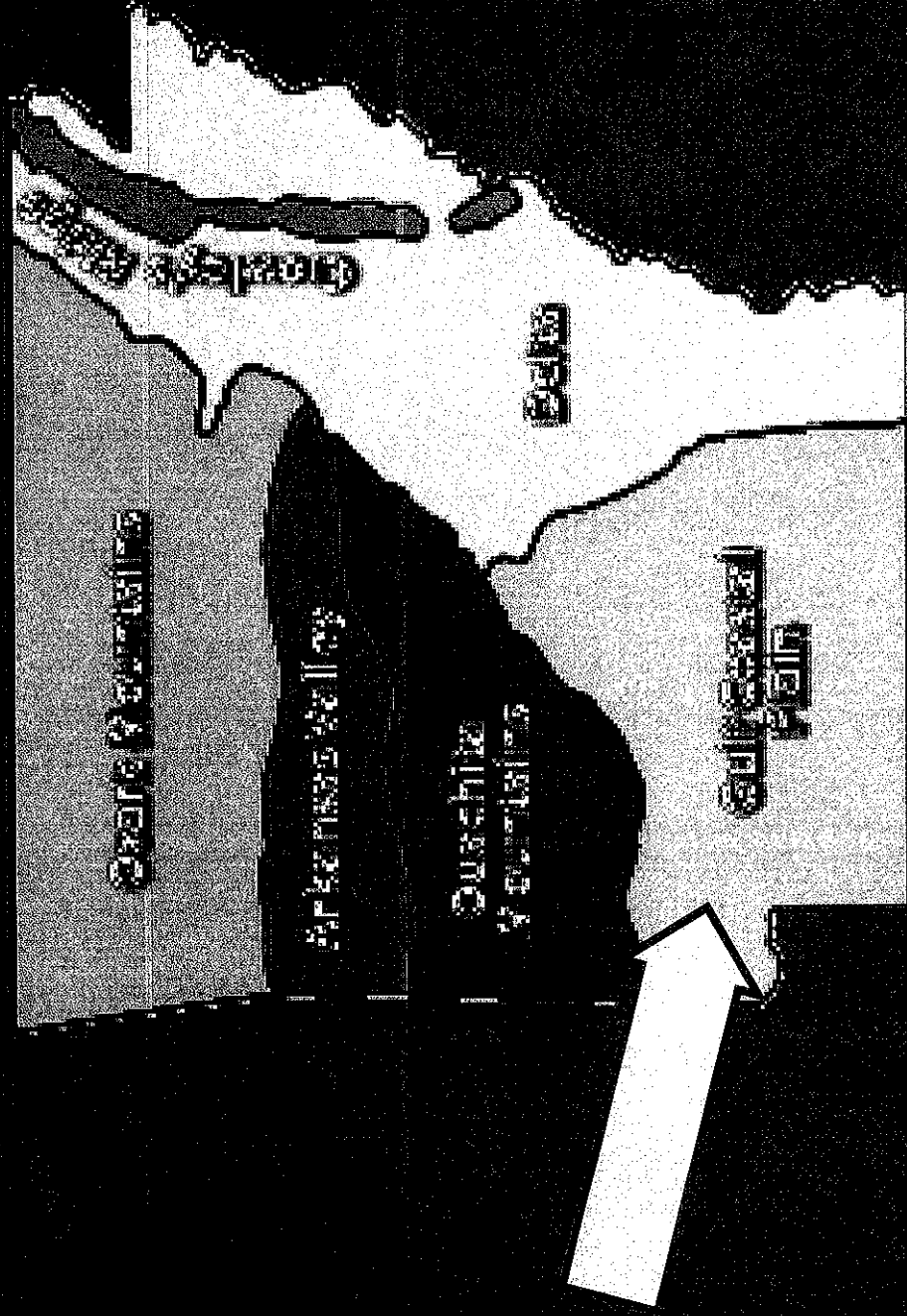




Grave of Benjamin

named"



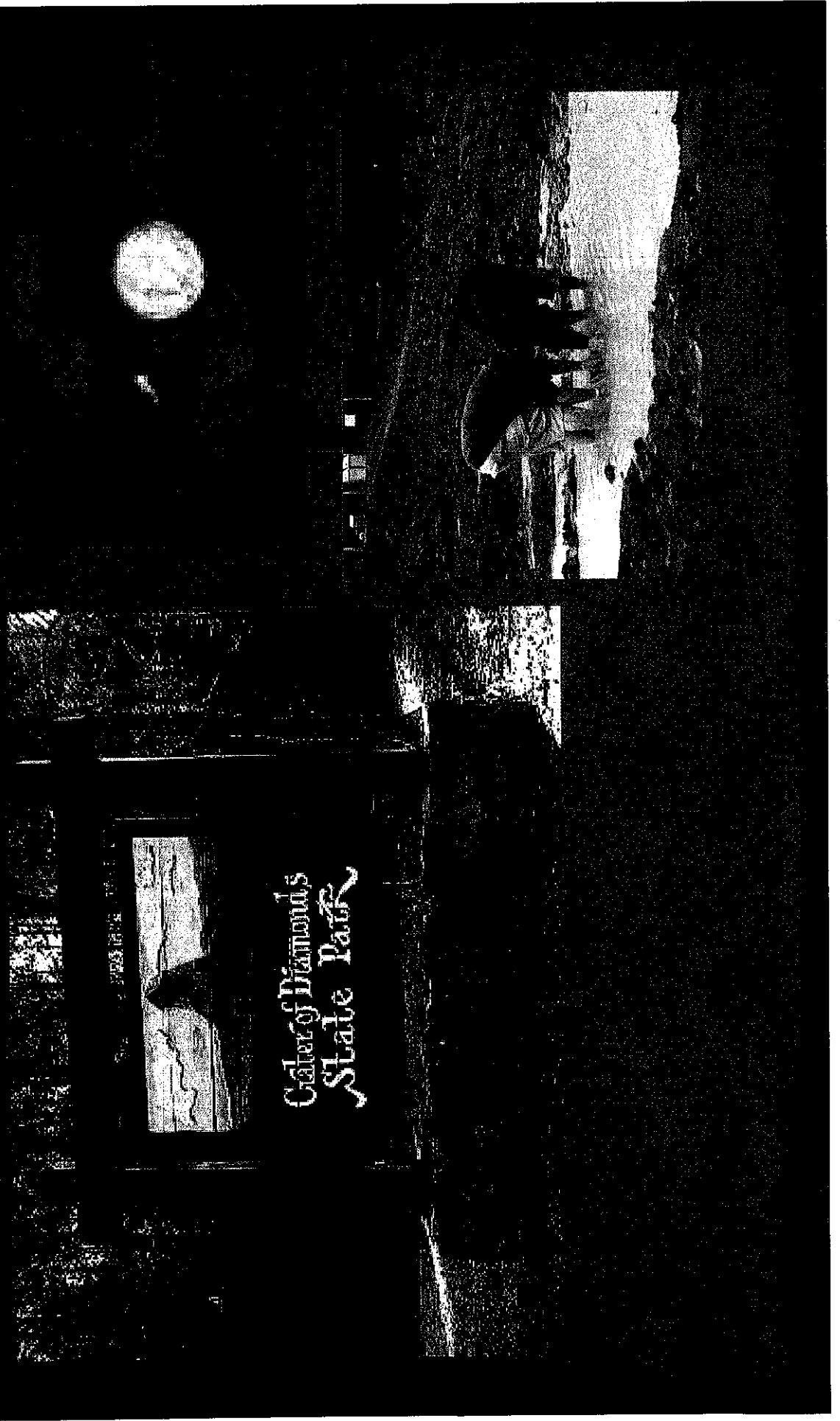
# West Gulf Coastal Plain



## West Gulf Coastal Plain

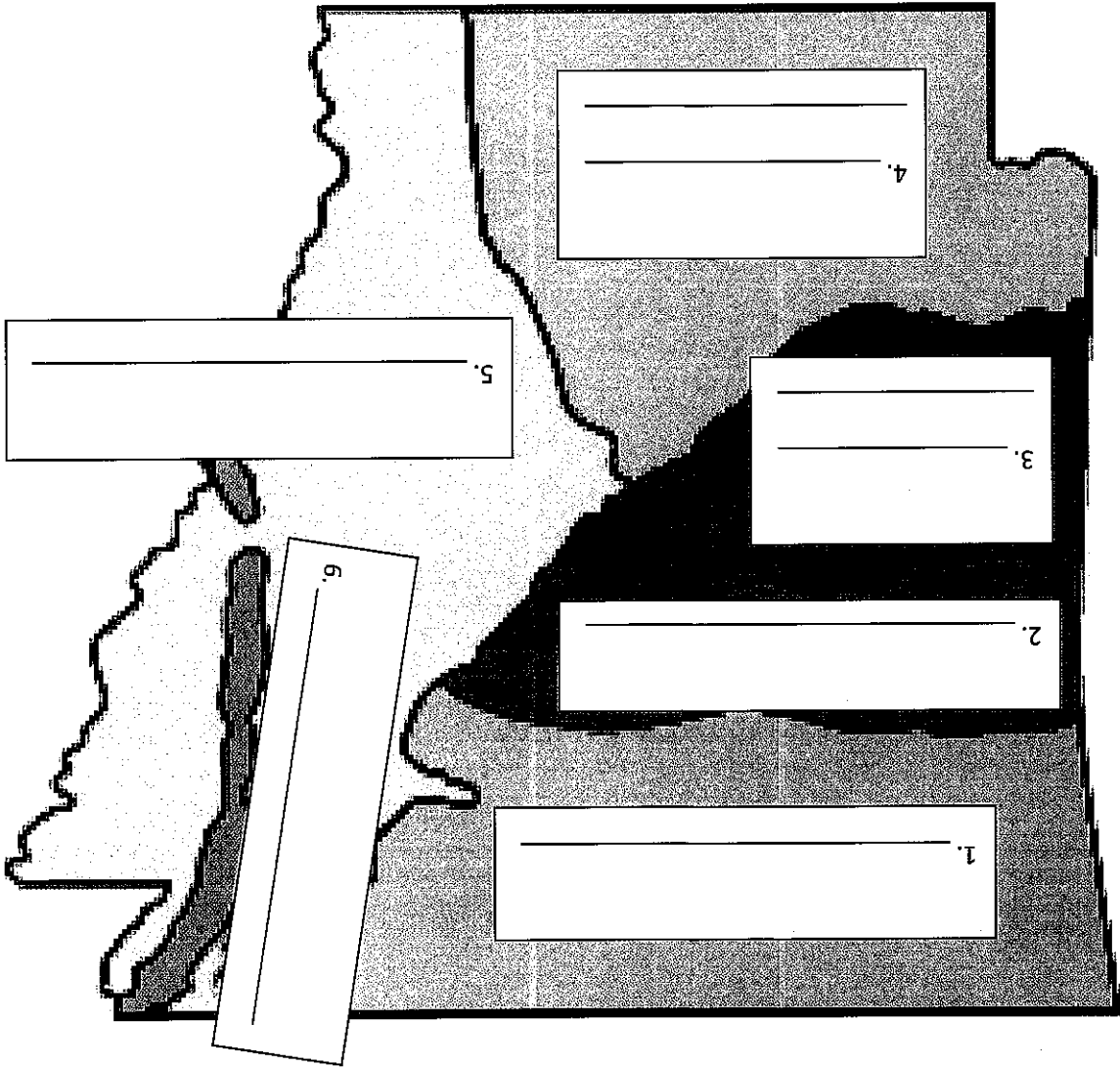
- In the lowland Region

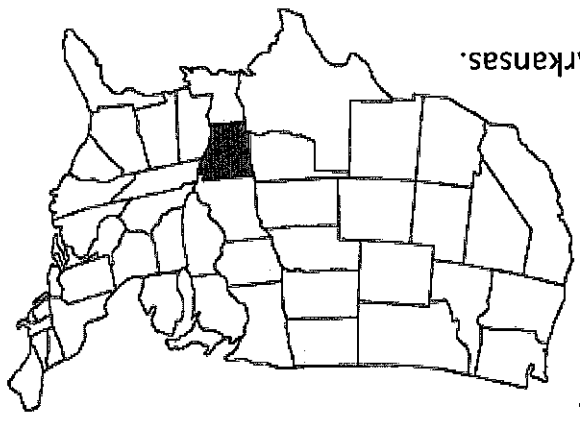

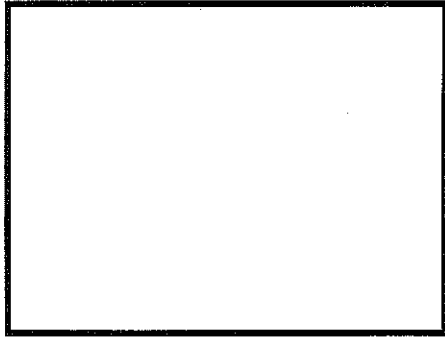

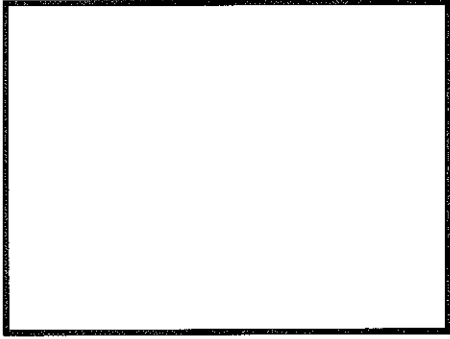
